#### POSITION SUMMARY

The Advocacy Intern will assist Mi Casa in moving forward on its Advocacy and Community Leadership work. Mi Casa advocates for the community it serves by serving on committees, councils and other leadership groups; through the media; and by advocating on issues at the local, state and federal level. While we are not an "advocacy" organization, we recognize that we have powerful stories to share that can inform and influence policy makers and the general public. Therefore, we have a responsibility to use this voice to support and empower our community. The Advocacy Intern will conduct research on legislation/proposed legislation and its impact on our community, help Mi Casa stay apprised on mission-related issues and opportunities to be more involved in advocacy efforts, and support and co-facilitate Mi Casa's staff Advocacy Committee. Candidates with a background or interest in social justice, anti-oppression, and/or empowerment-oriented practice with diverse clients are especially encouraged to apply, as Mi Casa would like to include more participant involvement in our advocacy efforts in the future.

- Help to plan and facilitate/co-facilitate Mi Casa's Advocacy Committee meetings and efforts
- Document Mi Casa's advocacy work
